ISU HEAD FOOTBALL COACH MATT CAMPBELL

Dave Cook began by sharing that Matt Campbell was raised in the football hotbed of Massillon, OH, home to famed Coaches Paul Brown (founder of the Browns and Bengals) and Bobby Knight. Some other notable Massillon Coaches were Earle Bruce and Bob Commings who went on to become head coaches at ISU and Iowa! Coach Campbell shared that after graduating from Massillon he attended college for a year at the University of Pittsburgh before transferring to Mt. Union College where his teams won three national championships—losing only one game during that span. After graduation he was a grad assistant at Bowling Green before returning as an assistant at Mt. Union. He later returned as a full assistant at Bowling Green before moving to Toledo as an assistant for several years and then the past three years as their head coach (did I mention that Coach Campbell is just 35 years old?!!). He shared that his philosophy with respect to building and maintaining a football program is based on three principles: recruit, retain, and develop quality players with great character. Players need to be committed to striving for both academic and athletic excellence, and his team at Toledo had one of the highest cumulative GPAs and five year

graduation rates in the country. His goal is develop great men, not just great football players—noting that character “lasts” long after one’s football playing days are done. He shared that after a time players can come to “accept” losing but he wants to develop culture where players, coaches, and fans expect to win. He shared that they are a long ways from getting there but he wants players who are committed to working hard every day on and off the field to get better and who learn to overcome adversity. Coach Campbell thanked the club for the opportunity to speak and invited everyone to the spring game at Jack Trice Stadium on April 16th.
