Dirk Ringgenberg, Mayor of Madrid

Marv Dufelmeier Dirk Ringgenberg who began serving as Madrid's new mayor Madrid, graduating from in Madrid High in 1987. He served 24 years in the Army in the Rangers paratroopers. and retiring with the rank of major. He noted that he related to "about half" the people in Madrid including the most recent mayor (who was a cousin) and his mother served as the city administrator at one time. He shared that his last command in Iraq involved being responsible for 1100 soldiers in a war zone, so the challenge of mayor serving as of а community of 3000 is "different" but not daunting. He indicated that leadership in the military or elected office is about in developing a shared vision, establishing priorities, settina goals, and putting strategies and plans in plan to execute those goals to realize the vision. When he retired from the military there was no question that he wanted to return home to Madrid and he opened a bicycle shop along the trail right
