

Sara Morton introduced Chris Norton, a young man who was paralyzed while playing football for Luther College on October 16, 2010. Since his injury Chris has made it his mission to try and use the lessons of his experiences to inspire and motivate others to overcome the challenges and obstacles they meet in their lives. Chris entitled his presentation “the power to stand”, noting that was all possess to power to stand up in response to the challenges we face and that how we respond when faced with setbacks and obstacles is “our choice”. Chris recounted how he was injured making a tackle in a football game, dislocating his neck and injuring his spinal column, initially rendering him unable to move or feel below his neck. After being transported to the Mayo clinic her underwent surgery on his neck and spent the next 129 in the hospital and another 98 days in intensive therapy. He was told there was only a3% chance that he would regain movement bellow his neck. While is physical paralysis was a huge challenge, Chris noted that he worked hard to avoid becoming “mentally paralyzed” by believing that no matter what happened he could still control his attitude and his effort, and that helped him persevere. Gradually, and with tremendous work and the support of his family and fiancé, Chris did regain the ability to move his upper

body and some feeling and movement in his legs. His goal upon returning to Luther was to graduate and walk across the stage to receive his diploma, and he shared the inspiring video of when he did with the help of his fiancé (who he’d proposed to the day before). He shared that his motto is “work hard, win easy” and he observed that when people say they “can’t” (do something) what they really mean is they “won’t”. He ended by sharing that life is wonderful and not meant to be easy”. Chris is truly an amazing, inspiring young man!
