#### Jack Lashier, Iowa Hall of Pride

Brian introduced former Boone Rotarian Jack Lashier who has been involved with the lowa High School Athletic Association's Hall of Pride since 1996. Jack shared that former Ex. Director Bernie Saggau talked to him back in 1995 about his vision for creating a Hall of Pride to recognize the achievements of Iowans the three A's-academics, athletics, and the arts. The Hall of Pride, which cost \$13 million to construct and furnish. opened adjacent to HyVee Hall and the Iowa Events Center in 1999. The Hall includes a Hall of Heroes that recognizes famous Iowans including Dan Gable, Shawn Johnson, Clyde Duncan. Nile Kinnick, Thompson, and Simon Estes. There are also modules for each high school in the state (and some that are no longer high schools) that include things like famous graduates and snippets of their school songs. (Trivia: the three most common school song tunes for lowa high schools are the Notre Dame Victory March, On Wisconsin, and the Illinois Loyalty). There are also a number of interactive exhibits where visitors can try their hand at shooting baskets, making (refereeing) the call, and Dance, Dance Revolution, Jack noted that due to a gift from MUSCO Lighting, every lowa student in grades K-12 can visit for free. Jack encouraged everyone to come and visit the Hall of Pride sometime!
