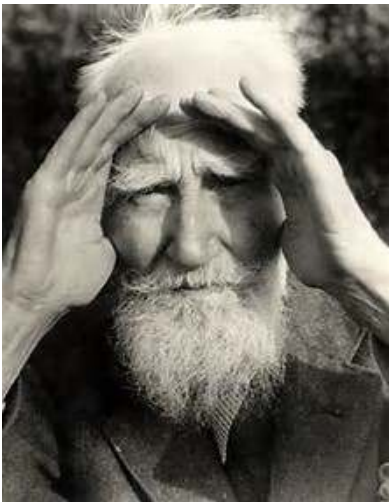

CLUB VISIONING RECAP

Dave Cook shared out some of the highlights from Club Visioning session that he facilitated for our club on February 4th. Those in attendance that day were asked to think about what our club would look like in 2022 (five years from now) if it was among “the best of the best” Rotary Clubs. Dave noted that nothing has been decided for certain as to the exact things our club will do, but members present that day considered twelve different areas that affect club vitality including things like public relations, service projects (current and possible new ones), our upcoming club centennial in May 2019, the possibility of establishing a satellite club, and membership. With respect to membership, those present on Wednesday who were not present at the February meeting were asked to “vote” on what they thought our membership should be in 2022—and once we decide on our goal we will need to look at ways to go about making it a reality. Dave did note that the membership of any future satellite club would be included in our overall membership totals. With respect

to a satellite club, this would consist of members for whom our Wednesday noon meeting time doesn't work (because they are out of town, or can't get away), so other meeting times and frequencies would be considered. There was discussion about some possible future projects or initiatives that might touch more students and heighten awareness of the work our club does on behalf of youth. The board and the club will be looking at the “next steps” we need to take to turn our vision into a plan and then our plan into action. Thanks again to Dave for the great job he did facilitating this process!
