Abby and Megan provided an update on the planning for this year's Rotary Auction that will take place at Seven Oaks on June 16th. Abby shared that "Save the Date" notices will be going out soon to everyone who has attended the auction in each of the past two years. She also reminded everyone that items for the auction need to be turned in to her at USBANK by May 19th in order to provide time to catalog them, develop the packages, and get the event program with the packages printed prior to the event. She noted that as of Wednesday she has received 26 items, which is still well short of the 90 items we had on hand last year. We also have four cash donors so far. Abby indicated donors at the e Platinum level (\$500 and above) will receive four tickets to the event and Gold Level (\$250-499) will receive two complimentary tickets. Megan and Abby encouraged members to think of donations that could be create packaged to unique experiences, and there was some

discussion of what some of these things might be (like dinners or combinations of tickets to events along with dinners). Abby did mention that this year's "wine grab" and raffle proceeds are going to be earmarked for Ericson Library and they will be deciding what in particular they will be going towards (i.e. Children's books, etc.) in the coming weeks. This year they have made arrangements for those who get bottles of wine in the grad grab to have them opened for a \$10 uncorking fee if they wish. They did ask that any donations for the wine grab be brought to Troy's office instead of the bank (evidently those pesky bank examiners can get the wrong idea when they see wine sitting around!). They are groups encouraging organizations that have been recipients of our Rotary grants to attend and support our event as well. Megan and Abby did say they could use help on the promotions committee-so if anyone is able to lend a hand, please let them know.
