

## Rep. Chip Baltimore—Legislative Update

Doug Thompson introduced State Representative Chip Baltimore who presented on update on the recently completed legislative session. Chip noted that it was an interesting year because after six years of "divided" government (the House and Gov. were Rep. and the Senate controlled by the Democrats) the state now has one party in control of both houses of the legislature and the Governor's office (and he noted that we do have a new Governor and "interim" Lt. Governor). He shared that just because there is one party control does not mean that everyone is in lock step, and members of same party often have deep differences of opinions on certain issues. He did say that in recent years that one or the other of the houses would pass a bill but it would often just be left to die in the other house, so it was difficult to get much done. He did say that upon arriving for this year's session, legislators and the Governor received notice of \$131 million downward estimate in revenues that required making substantial cuts in the current year's budget (the one ending June 30, 2017). They opted not to cut K-12 education or Medicaid so other areas of the budget received deeper cuts.

Then in March the REC (Revenue Estimating Conference) reduced the estimate even farther, necessitating some additional cuts and tapping of the reserves to cover the shortfall. He noted that that budget appears to be facing significant headwinds heading into the next session. Chip also discussed changes to the collective bargaining law, some water quality initiatives that were considering, and the fireworks bill. It was an interesting presentation and discussion—proving that at least at Rotary meeting civil discourse about public policy issues is possible!
