Before Isidro gave his presentation, his mother, Olga, read a heartfelt thank you note, expressing her gratitude to our club for supporting Isidro. She shared that he is a “different person” and grew tremendously over the past year. Isidro began by dropping some pretty serious Italian on us (he spoke no Italian before he left). When he resumed his talk in English he shared that he had said his experience was “the best year of his life” and that he too appreciated our club “believed in him” enough to provide him with this wonderful experience. He lived with four different host families—noting that the first one “didn’t really want him” but the other three were fantastic. He attended a school that emphasized the arts and he shared that Italian students must pick a school with a particular emphasis like the arts, languages, classics, or science at a fairly young age. Isidro chronicled his experiences in a blog he kept throughout the year and many of the episodes and experiences he was only able to touch no briefly during his talk were

discussed in much greater detail in his blog. He did say that his understanding of Spanish did enable him to start understanding Italian more quickly than otherwise might have been the case. All in all it sounds like Isidro had a great experience and he was a wonderful ambassador for our club, Rotary, and our country. Well done, Isidro!
