looking forward to the eclipse and Tony and Matt were happy about the rain (hopefully there won't be rain on Monday to spoil "our" eclipse!

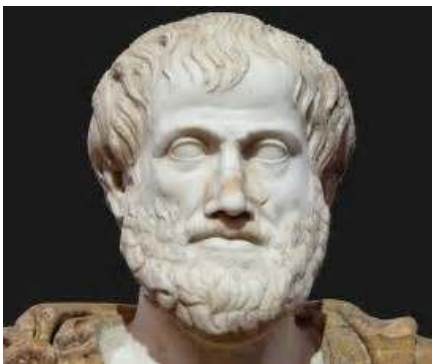


Rotary Youth Leadership Awards
