BOONE TV

Phil introduced Boone High School business and technology instructor, Ben Bravard. Mr. Bravard is also the advisor for the digital journalism program which includes Boone TV. Mr. Bravard shared that the idea for Boone TV began about five years ago as a concept to make journalism more engaging for students. The idea was to merge aspects of English (Mr. Kramer who is an English teacher is also an advisor), public speaking, interviewing skills, business, and technology into a program that would enhance student engagement, increase their employability skills, while provide fun, real world experience. In addition to being a benefit to students, Boone TV is a means to engage the community by helping them be informed about what is going on at schools and allowing them to see the quality content that students at Boone High are producing. Boone TV can be accessed via their website at www.BooneTV.com and on Facebook, Twitter, and YouTube. They have over 3000 "likes" on Facebook making them the second most followed school TV program in the state (behind one associated with Dowling football). Mr. Bravard shared that six former Boone High students are now pursuing degrees in digital

media and broadcast journalism. He introduced Anna Olson (jr.) and Sydney Woodruff (so.) who shared about their involvement with Boone TV and demonstrated some of the equipment they utilize including shoulder mounted cameras used for sporting events, microphones, and tripods. They also have a production studio which features a "green screen", teleprompter, and Adobe Premier editing software. Be sure to check out their weekly broadcasts
