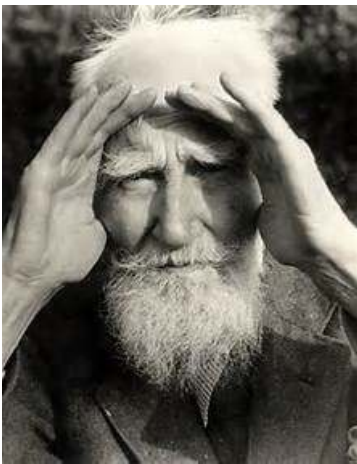

## Jim Heckman: Ogden Telephone Cooperative Fiber Optic Project

Tony Prouty introduced Jim Heckman who is the manager of the Ogden Telephone Cooperative. Jim took over as manager of the Cooperative earlier this year after spending many years in the agricultural field. Jim shared that the Ogden Telephone Cooperative has been in existence since 1904 and has undergone many changes since those early days. Three years ago they ran fiber to the homes in Ogden and this past summer they ran fiber connecting Ogden to Ames, creating redundancy resulting in “three routes” for Ogden to get internet service (so if one line gets cut, there are still two other ways to continuing getting service). They have purchased land in south Boone and are in process of beginning to lay fiber cable here as well. Jim noted that it will take 4-5 years to cover the entire town, moving from south to north. Jim shared that once the fiber is in place many residents will be able to

receive internet, phone, and television service at lower cost than is currently available. He did say that laying cable is not cheap, costing about \$30,000 to run a mile of fiber optic cable.
