Bob Herrick introduced Steve Cunningham of S&S Taxidermy. Bob noted that Steve provided some of the “big game” props for Boone Community Theater’s Teddy Roosevelt play, “Bully” last year and that was how he became familiar with Steve and his business. Steve shared that he was in the military for over 30 years and got involved in taxidermy as a pastime after her retired (with the help of vocational rehab training grant from the military). He started out taking a one week class in Wisconsin but he later became involved in the Iowa Taxidermy Association which provided other opportunities to learn more and interact with others in the field. Steve’s wife, who is an art instructor in Jefferson, is also a partner in the business and she does all the painting and “artistic” stuff involved in the process. Steve primarily works with deer but he also does fish and other game. He shared that to “clean” the meat, etc. off of fish they are place in a solution of Borax—which I am pretty sure is also the recipe for lutefisk!

In addition to his taxidermy business, Steve also serves as the Veterans’ Affairs Director for Boone County where he works to help veterans access benefits, vocational grants, and health care services.
