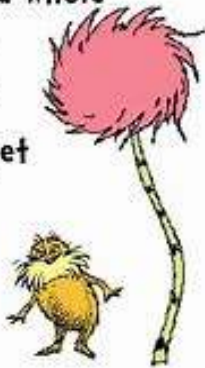

John Roosa, Boone County Environmental Services Director

Cody “the old triple threat” not only ran the meeting and served as sergeant at arms but he also lined up a speaker for our meeting at the last minute/ Cody heard John Roosa, the Environmental Services Director for the Boone County Landfill on KWBG earlier on Wednesday so he waited by the elevator until he finished and asked him if he’d like to “come to lunch” and give a program—and John was game! John spoke about how the recycling program in Boone is now working. John shared that recyclables no longer need to be sorted at the curbside as they handle that part of the process at the recycling center at the landfill. They then ship the materials to Mid-American Recycling in Des Moines who process and bail the materials for sale to entities that reuse them. The new process is saving the landfill about \$125,000 a year he reported. He did say that the amount that is recycled is growing but it is still just a fraction of the amount of “stuff” the landfill receives. He noted that the landfill takes in almost 50 tons of waste per day which would fill a room the size of our meeting area about three to four times! He did share that once waste is “entombed” in the landfill it really doesn’t break down very fast if at all—so what goes in as garbage remains as garbage (it is just buried). He did say that recycling helps divert materials that would

otherwise end up in the landfill which helps slow down the rate that each new “cell” in the landfill fills up. The last cell that was opened up cost \$2.4 million to create and it will be sufficient for a few more years. He discussed which items are recyclable and why some are not and he really encouraged everyone to get reusable bags for taking groceries home. He said the plastic bags associated with all sorts of shopping are a pain to deal with. Thanks to John for providing a very interesting update on very short notice!
