Andrew welcomed Courtney Clement who is the coordinator for the Retired and Senior Volunteer (RSVP) Program's volunteer, respite, and in-home visitation programs. Courtney shared that RSVP is a federally funded program but they also receive some support from the United Way, private donors, and Boone County (in kind donation of space in the Courthouse). Courtney coordinates the respite care program that provides support to caregivers so they can have a respite from caring for their loved ones to get out and go the grocery store, doctor's appointments, or other necessary things. They also have volunteers who visit people who are shut in to help keep them connected to the community, making them feel less isolated and lonely. They also have a medical equipment loan program with wheel chairs, crutches, and other mobility aids that people can borrow when needed. RSVP also provides volunteer manpower for other organizations including the Salvation Army, Boone Schools, Head Start Preschool, Boone and

Scenic Valley Railroad, Ericson Library, the Chamber, and IMPACT. RSVP members provided nearly 16000 hours of volunteer service last year which is a huge asset to our community—allow the budgets of many organizations to stretch further than would otherwise be possible. You need to be 55 years of age or older to be an RSVP volunteer—but she did say you could become a volunteer at a younger age if you are nominated by a current RSVP volunteer!
