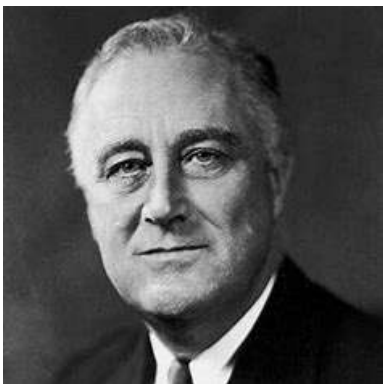

Dale Schoening--Iowa Municipal Band Festival

Dale Schoening of the Iowa Municipal Band Festival was our speaker on Wednesday. He shared that this year's date is July 14, 2018 at the Herman Park Pavilion. Community bands have been around since the mid-19th Century and Boone's band has been playing since 1917 – celebrating their 100th Anniversary last year! The Boone band is made up of 55 musicians and occasionally plays in other cities, even going to Germany in 2005. They play on Wednesday evenings beginning their summer concerts on May 30th.

Ted Erickson founded the Iowa Municipal Band Festival in 1992 along with committee members Marilyn Goldner, Tom Mowen, Dalene O'Brien, George Eckstein, Dave Richardson and Larry Moeller. Five bands played the first year. Dalene O'Brien is now the Festival's

Chair. Forty seven different bands have performed since the inception of the Festival including bands from Minnesota, Nebraska and even a band from Germany one year. There have been jazz bands, concert bands and even a Civil War band. This year's festival is from 11:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. with the Boone band playing at 6 p.m. Bring your own chairs.
