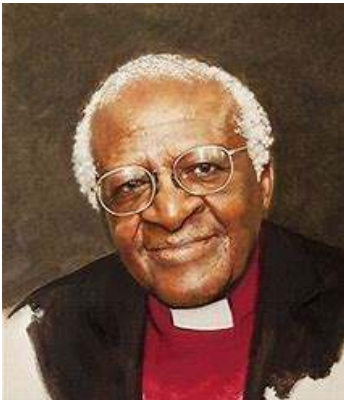

Julie Swigart, Manager of Boulders Inn and Suites and Fareway Events and Conference Center

Matt introduced Julie Swigart who is the new general manager of the Boulders Inn and Suites that opened with the last few weeks near the Business Park just south of Highway 30. Julie shared that all the rooms come equipped with refrigerators and microwaves and there is a free breakfast available for those lodging at the motel. The facility has 40 guest rooms including several larger suites and two rooms that are fully handicapped accessible. The Fareway Events and Conference Center has a seating capacity of between 350-400 and can be divided into smaller spaces if needed. The conference center has a large commercial kitchen attached to it as well as a smaller "household" type kitchen. The meeting space has sophisticated audiovisual equipment including three large, drop down projection screens, handheld and lavalier microphones, and several large screen TVs. The space is available for meetings, weddings, and

other types of events requiring larger spaces. They have three preferred caterers who can provide food for various events as well. Boulders started in 2008 and now have 15 properties in Iowa and one in Missouri. The entrance features a rock wall and nice space for breakfast and full service bar.
