

TROY THOMPSON—Rotary Foundation Update

Generosity is giving more than you can, and pride is taking less than you need.

Troy shared that District Foundation Chair Chris Knapp graciously let him use the slides he presented to the Evening Club last Monday. Troy began by noting that the Rotary Foundation (TRF) is widely recognized as honest, effective, and efficient foundation. The Foundation has very low costs and money donated to Annual Fund that supports projects at both the local and international levels is invested for three years and the earnings on the amount donated are used to cover all the costs of running the Foundation so that 100% of the dollars donated are ultimately used for actual projects! Our club has received funding from the Foundation for some projects locally including \$4000 to help fund the purchase of the automatic external defibrillators (AEDs) we placed in all area schools a few years ago, \$5000 towards our Centennial project and (if my memory is correct) part of the cost of putting the kitchen in at the former Crawford Hall facility. There are three areas within the Foundation including the Annual Fund (much of which comes back to the local districts to direct towards local or international projects), the Polio Fund, and the permanent Endowment Fund. Troy and Lisa shared that our club no

longer handles donations to the Foundation through our regular club statements (it was a bookkeeping challenge) but rather through members getting signed up to do so directly with the Foundation. You can get signed up by using your MyRotary account or Troy and Lisa can provide you with the forms needed to get signed up. It was shared that our club was the top giving club to the Rotary Foundation with per capita contributions of \$534.71! Thank you to Troy for sharing about TRF and **CONGRATULATIONS!** At the end of his talk President Lisa presented Troy with his Paul Harris plus 8 pin signifying his tremendous, ongoing support of TRF!
