Justin Adams, Boone Fire Chief

Andrew introduced Boone Fire Chief Justin Adams as our speaker. Justin shared that the department consists of mix of full-time, part-time, and volunteer firefighters. Usually there are at least three members of the department on duty at any time. Services provided by the department include firefighting, emergency services, technical rescue services such as extracting people from car accidents, rope rescues (like when someone falls off the lookout rock at Ledges—yikes!), and grain bin extractions, hazardous material management, and fire prevention and inspection services. The service area for firefighting is 170 miles (all of Boone and about 1/3 of the county) and they cover the entire county with EMS services. This past year they have over 1500 calls. Justin shared that back in 2003 the total number of calls was under 900—and the number seems to grow a bit more every year (so they stay very busy). He did share that many of the fire

hydrants in town (3000 in all) are looking faded and discolored, so this spring they will be challenging groups and organizations to take on scraping and repainting hydrants as a project (they will provide the paint). He hinted that whichever group paints the most could receive (another!) trophy! The total budget for the department is \$1.2 million of which 94% is for salaries and benefits. Justin also shared that the department will be looking to purchase a new firetruck soon which could cost upwards of \$650,000 (but they last for 40 years) so they “aren’t cheap”!
