## IOWA WOLVES POLIO PLUS EVENT

Ed Arnold of the NW Des Moines Rotary Club, who had chaired the Iowa Energy/Wolves/Polio Night at Wells Fargo since its inception over 10 years ago was on hand to encourage our club to get involved in the is event again this year. He noted that this year's game will be on February 2 when the Wolves play the Memphis Hustle. Tickets for the game will be \$24-30 dollars and the Wolves then donate \$20 per

ticket towards District 6000's polio eradication efforts. Since this fundraiser started the District has raised enough money to immunize 150,000 children against polio—and our club's contributions would have paid for 3500 of those doses of polio vaccine! 

Lisa introduced David Hansen of the Ames Rotary Club who presented an update on the Xicotepec (Karla's home town!) project. David was responsible for the initial contacts with Rotarians in Xicotepec that led to the formation of the partnership many years ago when he was Executive Director of a non-profit affiliated with the land grant universities in Iowa ((ISU) and four other neighboring states focused on rural development. When he returned to Iowa he shared his story with Ray Munson (who was then DG of District 6000) and shortly thereafter the Xicotepec relationship was established. David said that relationship has resulted in a number of very successful, smaller initiatives-which he noted is not the direction that the Rotary Foundation is going currently which is focused on larger (\$35,000 would be considered "small") projects that become locally sustainable. Among the projects Rotarians from District 6000 have been involved in in Xicotepec are the construction of

an orphanage, a bilingual (Spanish/indigenous) school, a pharmacy, school construction, dental care, and several other water quality and public health initiatives. Our current RYE student, Carla, is from Xicotepec!
