

Lucy Holms, project manager for Prevent Child Abuse Iowa

Sara introduced Lucy Holms who is a project manager from Prevent Child Abuse Iowa. Lucy presented an abbreviated version of longer presentation regarding the Connections Matter program. Lucy shared that PCA Iowa works in a variety of areas including program development and legislative advocacy. One of their major legislative initiatives has been to create a single (free) Mandatory Reporter module for health care professionals, teachers, and other who are "mandatory reporters" of suspect child abuse. Currently there are a host of programs and they have worked to create one that can be used statewide. Lucy also spoke about adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) that can have lasting impact on individuals for their entire lives. Some of the ACEs they have monitored include emotional, physical, and sexual abuse, substance abuse in the home, separation or divorce, mental illness in the family, domestic violence,

and having a family member incarcerated. They are also starting to collect data on emotional and physical neglect which are among the most common ACEs. She noted that 56% of those surveyed reported experiencing at least one of the ACEs and the research shows that experiencing four or more increases the risk of developing depression (6Xs greater), cancer (1.47Xs), diabetes (1.88 Xs). Student who experience ACEs tend to less well in school and are more likely to engaging in smoking, drinking, and other unhealthy behaviors.
