Centennial Project

It was shared that the video from Channel 5 highlighting the restoration of the passenger car and sharing about our Centennial project is on our club Facebook page. Sandblasting of the car is going well and then it will be pulled into the shop for priming and painting. Cody shared that the original estimate for paint was \$11,500 but Arnold Motor Supply came through and it will only cost \$7500! Many thanks to Arnolds! Lisa reported that we are planning on doing a direct mailing with postcards to try and solicit additional donations from individuals and families who may be interested in supporting our project and asked that anyone

with any experience or interest in that let her know. Dave mentioned contacting Earl May (which is also celebrating its 100th anniversary this year) about possibly helping out with some plantings or landscaping. He noted that a number of rather substantial trees are going to have to be moved or removed from the site so he also asked if anyone knew where we might find someone with a tree mover. Dave noted that they are still looking how we are going to get the cars in place—whether it would be from off Story Street or perhaps from Marshall.
