Ron Bittle, Hilltop Greenhouse

Ron Bittle, the owner of Hilltop Greenhouse, was introduced as our speaker. Ron has been in plant business for over 40 years and his greenhouse facilities are located north of Highway 30 just west of Ogden. Ron's noted that when it comes to taking care of most plants is that most people tend not to water them enough—but this year that has been less of a problem due to the abundance (record) of rainfall. Some plants are looking “yellow” due to too much water. Ron primarily sells (wholesale with some retail) annual plants, noting that annuals tend to flower for most of the season providing color and beauty. Perennial plants tend to have rather short periods where the bloom (peonies, tulips, and those danged yucca plants). Most of the plants he sells have been bred to be easy to care for, requiring little more than regular watering and occasional fertilization. Some plants, like geraniums, still have “weedlike” hardiness but others, like mums have had that weedlike hardiness

bred out of them in the pursuit of more colors, etc. (So the “hardy” mums you buy are not as likely to overwinter if you plant them anymore). Ron noted the hanging baskets and planters featuring primarily pink petunias in downtown Boone all came from his greenhouse—and they are looking really good this year. At the end of his presentation Ron awarded several petunia plants, a geranium, a mixed coleus planter, and mum. Thanks to Ron for another very interesting presentation!
