Dave Cook announced that the grant team received a letter from the Prairie Meadows Foundation that our project has been awarded a \$20,000 grant! Dave also shared that the site plan is slated to be approved by the city council, perhaps as soon as July 10 so things really moving ahead. 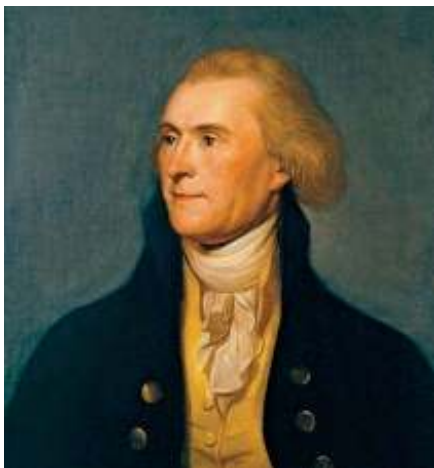

Pres. Vicki began by noting that the past few months have been challenging with the elimination of her position and the YMCA and her husband, Lou's, health issues but she is taking the summer to relax, spend more time together, and to settle in as our president. Vicki had sent out a survey monkey a few months ago seeking input from members to six questions. The first was "why are you in Rotary?" The words that most frequently came up in the responses were service, community, and to be of help. The second question related to challenges in our community and the most often cited needs related to food insecurity and literacy. She also asked whether members would prefer to continue to meet weekly or perhaps bimonthly, or if we wanted to forgo one meeting a month in lieu of a service project. There was some interest in meeting bimonthly and Vicki led a discussion among those present about some of the pros and cons. Continuing to look at meal options and the impact they

have on the cost of membership was discussed as well. In response to asking what member's hidden talents are members evidently chose to keep them hidden! For fun members like to read, drink, golf, and be with friends. Vicki shared that once a month we will have a meeting dedicated to a networking session where three or four members will share about themselves to allow other members to get to know them better. She is also having new member orientation packets prepared and would like to see Rotary mentors paired with new members to help them feel more strongly attached to the club. She will also be approaching some members about becoming part of a membership committee. She did share that we will continue to participate in many of the service projects we have been doing that make such a difference in our community and we will also look at ways to engage in some type of international service project as well.
