Joe Smith, Executive Director of Boone County Hospital

Randy Purdy began by sharing that as lowans we tend to sometimes “take things for granted” and under appreciate their importance—like the importance of having a strong county hospital in our community. He welcomed Joe Smith and invited him to share an update on Boone County Hospital. Joe noted the past two years had been “very tough” with the loss of Unity Point (and a number of physicians) that negatively impacted the hospital’s revenue. He indicated that the hospital’s cash reserves slipped to the point there was a time they only had about 15 days of operating expenses in reserve (down from over 90 a few years ago). He was happy to report that things have improve this year and they are now have upwards of 60 days in reserves again. Joe noted that hospitals in Grinnell and Newton were forced to join larger entities (Mercy or Unity Point) in order to remain viable and Marshalltown’s hospital actually went bankrupt and was taken over by a group out of Waterloo. On the positive side of things he shared that a new physician will be joining the clinic staff in September and that they now have an endocrinologist (Dr. Wright) and a rheumatologist providing services in the specialty clinics. The walk in clinic has been very successful as well and the BCH Foundation has been very

supportive providing a new ambulance, 3D mammography unit, and a new ultrasound machine. Looking ahead Joe shared that he thinks the landscape of health care is going to continue to evolve and it is going to be increasingly difficult for any on hospital or physician group to go it alone. Joe and board of the hospital have retained a consultant to help them and they look ahead to what options might be beneficial as they continue to work to make sure the hospital remains a strong and vibrant part of our community.
