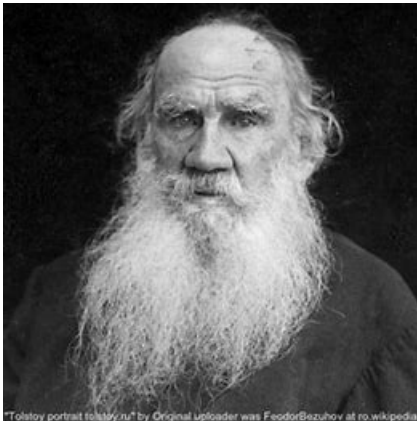
Interact Club Proposal—RYLA Students

The two students who recently attended the RYLA Conference, Akela Salter of Boone and Caroline Shelton of Ogden, shared their idea for a starting a joint Boone-Interact Club (a high school version of Rotary). At the RYLA Conference they heard about other communities that have Interact Clubs and were paired with other participants (themselves in this case) to think about ways of establishing clubs in their areas. They noted that there are other clubs that are involved in various projects but the Interact Club would be dedicated to providing students with opportunities to be involved in service. They would need assistance from the club in helping to sponsor the club and would probably need to have a teacher at the High School serve as a faculty representative as well. They hope to get the word out about the club to students at assemblies and they really would like their club to be very inclusive—open to everyone with an interest in being involved in an organization dedicated to service in the community. They mentioned that some of the projects or areas they envision as possible service

projects include involvement with local nursing homes and sending suitcases filled with clothes, food, and other needs to kids in third world countries. The contents of the suitcases would help meet some needs and the suitcases would be able to serve as “closets” as well. Akela and Caroline will be meeting with district administrators and possibly the school boards as they pursue the goal of establishing an Interact Club.
