Kit Curran, Exec. Dir. of Salisbury House

Bill Curran introduced his daughter, Kit Curran, who is the executive director of the Salisbury House Foundation in Des Moines. Kit was pleased that many members of the club have visited Salisbury House noting that “historic homes” are experiencing a host of challenges around the country. Salisbury House was built by Carl and Edith Weeks between 1923-1928. They wanted to build a house similar in design to Kings House in Salisbury England (hence the name). The budget was \$150,000 but it ended up costing about \$3 million. The house was constructed using materials from England including oak timbers from the 1600s! Following the stock market crash and Depression the Weeks were no longer able to afford the home and so they donated it to Drake University who found they too could not afford it so they sold it to the Iowa State Education Association in 1954 who eventually sold it (for \$4 million) to the Salisbury Foundation in 1998. Kit noted that maintaining and operating the home required significant funding which is an ongoing challenge. To eliminate the debt the Foundation had going back to a 2006 facility

upgrade they recently sold the book collection to Grinnell College who will actually be able to better archive the collection and who will also make the books available digitally for research. Kit invited members to come and visit (she said she be happy to give you a tour!) Salisbury House which hosts many events throughout the year! Thanks to Kit for very interesting program on this “hidden gem”.
