Academic & Vocational Education Scholarships



The Rotary Club of Boone is an organization of business, civic and professional community leaders whose purpose is to promote, foster and encourage the ideals of “SERVICE ABOVE SELF.” Boone Rotarians believe that generations who develop an appreciation for serving others at an early age, will greatly enhance not only our community, country and world, but build a brighter future for all.

To that end, the Rotary Club of Boone established “SERVICE ABOVE SELF” Scholarships to encourage and promote community service and leadership among students in Boone County, and reward the achievements of those students who have exemplified these ideals. Boone Rotary awards two types of “SERVICE ABOVE SELF” scholarships for students in our area. Each has different Eligibility Requirements and Selection Criteria. To begin the application process, select the type of scholarship for which you meet all Eligibility Requirements and Selection Criteria. You may not apply for both.

Academic Scholarships

Multiple Academic Scholarships will be awarded for applicants pursuing an academic degree at a post-secondary college or university. Total number of scholarships awarded is dependent on number of qualified applications received.

A. Eligibility Requirements - Candidates must meet each of the following conditions:

- Must be a U.S. citizen.
- Must be a graduating senior residing in Boone County.
- Must have a cumulative high school G.P.A. (freshman through 1st semester of senior year) of 3.2 (87th percentile) or greater.
- Must be planning to pursue an academic degree at an accredited post-secondary community college, college or university. Academic Scholarships are not intended for applicants who plan to pursue a vocational or technical certification.
- Applicant *cannot* be a child or grandchild of a member of Boone Rotary.
- Scholarships are nonrecurring. Applicant cannot have received a Rotary Academic Scholarship or Vocational Education Scholarship previously.

B. Selection Criteria (please note: importance is placed in order from 1 to 4)

1. **Service** - Has demonstrated a substantial commitment to “SERVICE ABOVE SELF” in their school, their community, their church or elsewhere.
2. **Character** - Demonstrates character, integrity, and qualities consistent with Rotary’s Four-Way Test (1. Is it the Truth? 2. Is it Fair to all concerned? 3. Will it build good will and better friendships? 4. Will it be beneficial to all concerned?).
3. **Academic Achievement** - Must have a cumulative high school (freshman through 1st semester of senior year) G.P.A. of 3.2 (87th percentile) or greater. All applicants with a cumulative G.P.A of 3.2 or greater will be given equal academic consideration.

Vocational Education Scholarships

Multiple Vocational Education Scholarships will be awarded for applicants pursuing a vocational/technical program. Examples of vocational programs include, automotive technology, bookkeeping, building trades, criminal justice, dental hygiene, early childhood education, heating & air-conditioning, licensed practical nursing, medical assisting and many others. Total number of scholarships awarded is dependent on number of qualified applications received.

A. Eligibility Requirements - Candidates must meet each of the following conditions:

- Must be a U.S. citizen.
- Must either be: 1) graduating senior of Boone, Madrid or Ogden High School, or another high school but residing in Boone County or 2) previous graduate from Boone, Madrid or Ogden High School, or 3) resident of Boone County throughout the past 3 years.

- Must be accepted for enrollment in a program providing vocational/technical certification or degree upon completion of program.
- Applicants must be planning to pursue a vocational/technical certification. Eligible students must enroll in a program leading to a certificate or degree, and plan to go directly into employment in that field upon completion of the program.
- Applicant *cannot* be a child or grandchild of a member of Boone Rotary.
- Scholarships are nonrecurring. Applicant cannot have received a Rotary Academic Scholarship or Vocational Education Scholarship previously.

B. Selection Criteria (please note: importance is placed in order from 1 to 4)

1. **Service** - Has demonstrated a substantial commitment to "SERVICE ABOVE SELF" in their school, their community, their church or elsewhere.
2. **Character** - Demonstrates character, integrity, and qualities consistent with Rotary's Four-Way Test (1. Is it the Truth? 2. Is it Fair to all concerned? 3. Will it build good will and better friendships? 4. Will it be beneficial to all concerned?).

Application Requirements

1. **The deadline for submitting applications is April 1st.**
2. Required documents include:
 - _ Completed scholarship application, including "Service Above Self and 4-Way-Test" essay.
 - _ Copy of the applicant's high school transcript.
 - _ Signed Application Checklist.
 - _ Two (2) letters of recommendation.
