
time will probably seem to zip by! Doug was happy to have the opportunity to sit by Vern and many members were looking forward to hearing from our program speakers.

## Eastern Star Health Center

We were joined by several members of the staff at Eastern Star Masonic Home who presented on their soon to open new Wellness Center including Jessica Bluhm who is the Wellness Coordinator, Leah Sterbick who is the Director of Social Services, Jessica Greco (that's "Greeko"! ) who is the Director of Rehabilitation Services and Christina Walsh who is the Director of Quality Improvement. The Wellness Center has been in the works for some time and will be run by Aegis Therapy which is national company that provides a range of therapy services in care facility settings including physical, speech, and occupational therapy. When it is open the

facility which will include a walking track, spinning bikes, weight and cardio equipment, and a therapy pool will be available to residents and staff at the OES Home. In addition community members who are 50 and over can join as members as well. They will be setting the cornerstone for the Wellness Center during a ceremony at 1:00 PM on February 28<sup>th</sup> and they will be having a Grand Opening and Ribbon Cutting at 10:00 AM on March 10<sup>th</sup>. There will be dressing rooms and shower facilities available as well for members to use. They noted that community members can join at a the Silver level which includes use of the track and equipment or the Gold Level that also includes participation in classes and passes to use the hydrotherapy pool a certain number of times per month.
