We are still in need of additional donations to pay some of the bills associated with relocating the train and

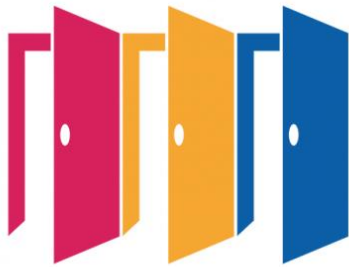

Susan Herrick introduced George Beltisos, noting that she has known him for over 40 years! George was the founder and longtime CEO of Youth and Shelter Services (YSS) and is a member of Ames Noon Rotary Club. Since retiring from YSS he has worked to establish the **Iowa Network against Human Slavery and Trafficking**. He shared that human trafficking is not just an international phenomenon and Iowa youth and being impacted by trafficking as well. In working to get the network off the ground he sought and received a \$10,000 donation from the Ames Noon Rotary Club which was matched by a \$5000 District grant. He was very happy to share that DGE Alka is going to be a board member for the organization and she is planning on making increasing awareness and stopping human trafficking one of the centerpiece plans for her year as District Governor. George is trying to get making the elimination of human trafficking a priority for not only local Rotary Clubs but RI as a whole. He asked our club to consider endorsing a resolution to the effect that in turn could be submitted by District 6000 to RI's Council on Legislation in hopes of making

Rotary's "next big priority" after the elimination of polio. He shared several ways that local clubs and members can increase awareness and be the "eyes and ears" needed to shed light on this hidden, heinous crime. He noted that trafficking is the worst form of child abuse, stealing the child's family, freedom, body, and education from them and affects 40 million kids and young adults worldwide of which less than 1% are ever rescued. Thanks to George for working to increase awareness of this serious problem!
