COVID Vaccine Update

Troy introduced Tacy Hyberger who is the assistant administrator for clinical operations at Boone County Hospital and Brian Mehlhaus who was (literally) wearing his doctor hat on Wednesday! Tacy said that the pathway for vaccines runs from the manufacturers to the Feds to the States to county health departments. So far Boone County has received several thousand doses of the Moderna vaccine which has been enough to vaccinate (at least with their first dose) county healthcare workers, hospital staff, and Woodward State Hospital employees (of which there are close to 600). They have also begun vaccinating EMS and fire fighters. She noted that 63% of Boone County Hospital employees have either received the vaccine or tested positive for COVID (which is believed to afford at least temporary immunity) so far. The Moderna vaccine requires a second dose to be administered 28 days after the initial dose. They have been receiving about 200-300 doses at a time. She shared that side effects from the first dose have primarily been a "sore arm" but she did say quite a number of those vaccinated have reported feeling sore and bit feverish after

receiving their second dose (which is not unexpected). People can go the Boone County Hospital website to access the Vaccine page for updates or call 433-VAXX. Phone lines will soon be open and they hope to have an online registration process in place soon. It is hoped that there will be enough vaccine to immunize teachers and school personnel (in group 1B along with those 65 and older) by the end of February. Brian shared the vaccine side effects are comparatively mild but the benefits associated with getting a significant percentage of the population some measure of immunity are great. He did share that nursing homes and long term care facility workers and residents are also in the process of getting vaccinated but that is being handled through Walgreens or CVS Pharmacies, not the public health department. He did say there may eventually be doses in pharmacies but most of them have small spaces that do not allow for distancing to be easily maintained so it is likely that the county will rely on larger "mass" vaccination sites for a while where distancing is easier to manage. Thanks to Tacy and Brian for a very informative update.
